This district includes the whole Cities of Alturas, Anderson, Biggs, Chico, Colusa, Corning, Dorris, Dunsmuir, Etna, Fort Jones, Gridley, Live Oak, Marysville, Montague, Mount Shasta, Orland, Oroville, Red Bluff, Redding, Shasta Lake, Susanville, Tehama, Tulelake, Weed, Wheatland, Williams, Willows, Yreka, and Yuba City, and the community of Paradise. This district unites the counties of the far north, which share a rural lifestyle and an agriculture- and ranching-based economy. Residents of this region also share concerns related to wildfires and are linked by Interstate 5, which runs north to south through this district.

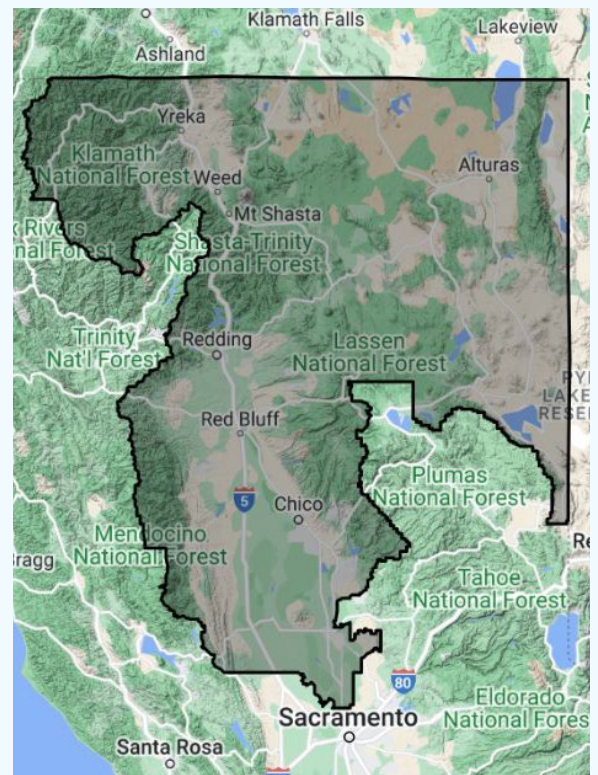

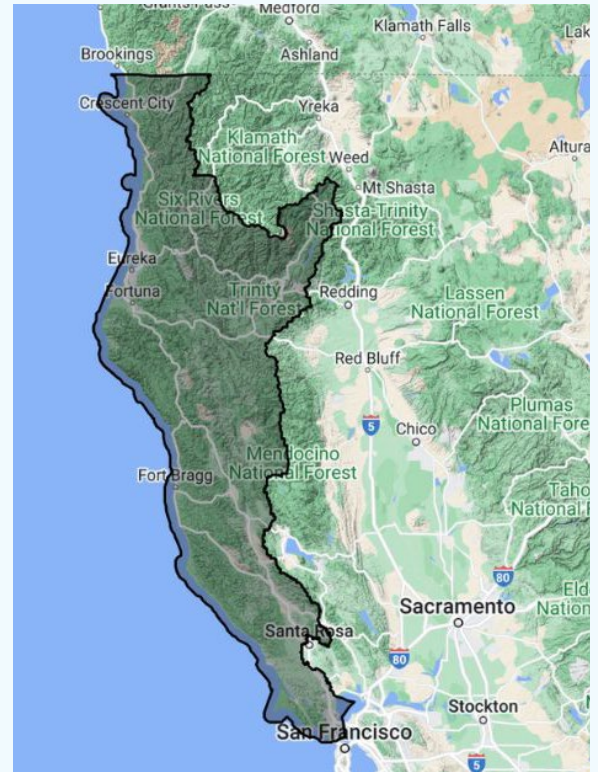

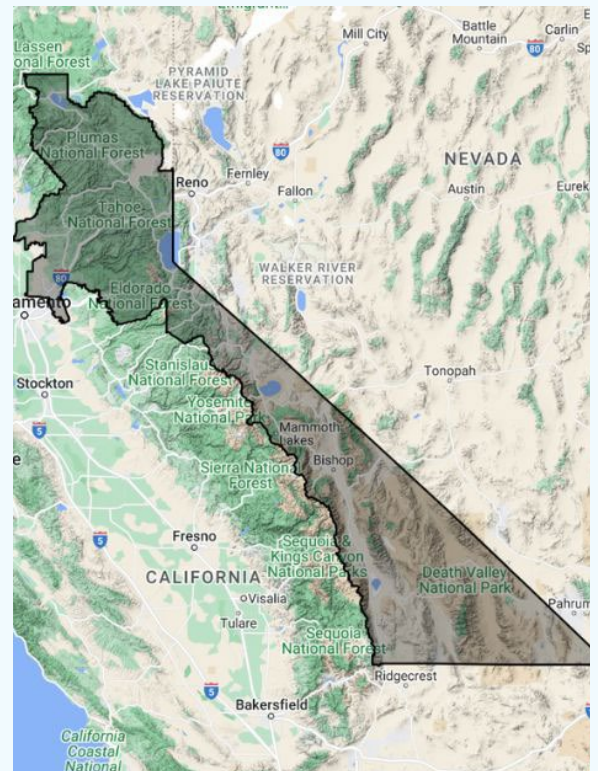

Elected to Congress in 2008. He began his political career in 1982 when, at the age of 26, he was elected to the State Assembly in Ventura County. He gave up the seat in 1992 to run for Congress against then Democratic Rep. Anthony Beilenson, to whom he lost. In 1994, he was the Republican nominee for state Controller, narrowly losing to Kathleen Connell 48% - 46%. He was again elected to the Assembly in 1996 and then elected to the Senate in 2000. In 2002, McClintock ran for state Controller once again and suffered an even narrower loss to Democrat Steve Westly 45.4% - 45.1%. He was elected to Congress in 2008. He received a degree from UCLA (BA). McClintock is the father of two children. His wife, Lori, passed away unexpectedly in late 2021.

COMMUNITY:

CD05 includes the whole Counties of Amador, Tuolumne, Mariposa, and Calaveras, portions of Fresno, Stanislaus, Madera and El Dorado Counties, the whole the Cities Amador City, Angels, Hughson, Lone, Jackson, Oakdale, Placerville, Plymouth, Riverbank, Sonora, Sutter Creek, and Waterford, and portions of the Cities of Fresno, Turlock, and Modesto. 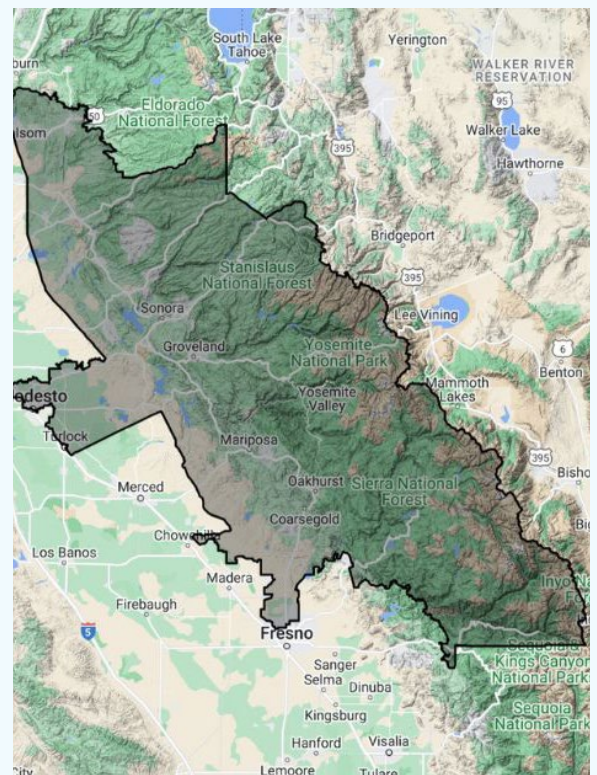

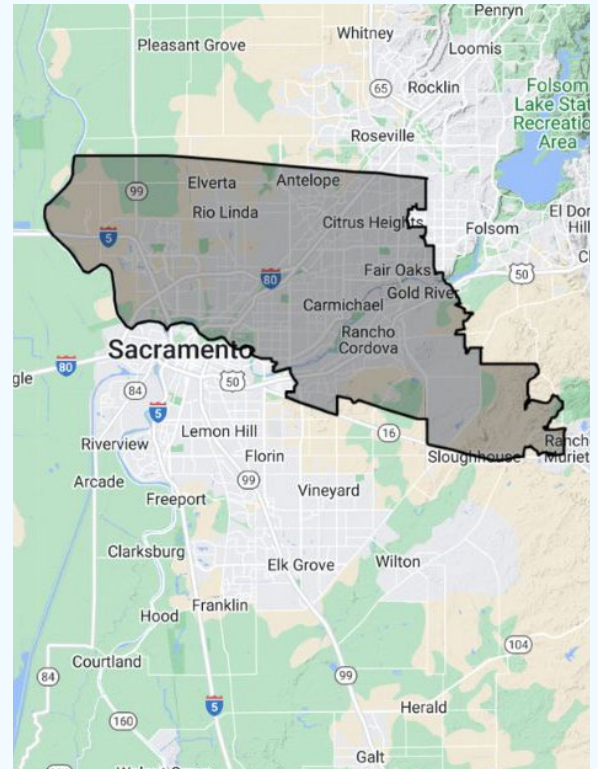

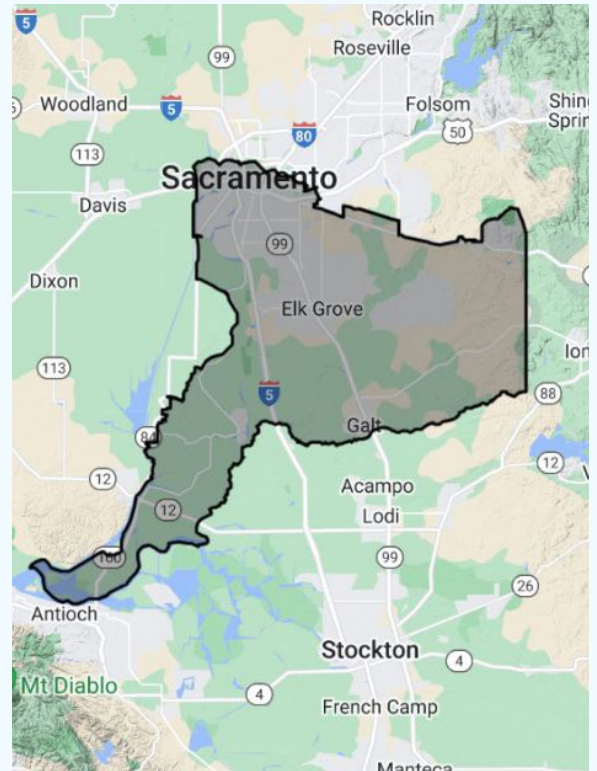

Representative Matsui was born in a Japanese internment camp in Poston, Arizona. She grew up in Dinuba, CA in the Central Valley. She earned a degree from UC Berkeley (BA). Her husband served on the Sacramento City Council and she served as a volunteer on the Bill Clinton campaign in 1992. She later served on his transition team and then worked in the White House from 1993 to 1998. Representative Matsui worked in Washington, DC while her husband served in Congress. He died in January 2005 and she announced she would run for his seat. She won the election by a large margin and has performed well in each subsequent election. She represents the district in California with the most registered democrats.

COMMUNITY:

CD07 includes portions of the Counties of Solano and Yolo, the whole Cities of Isleton, Elk Grove, West Sacramento, and Galt, and portions of the City of Sacramento and Sacramento County to balance population while considering communities of interest. This district features the downtown areas of Sacramento that share metropolitan services and school districts. The district follows the American River as a natural border. Suburban and more rural areas in this district have a shared interest in flood control and protecting green spaces. 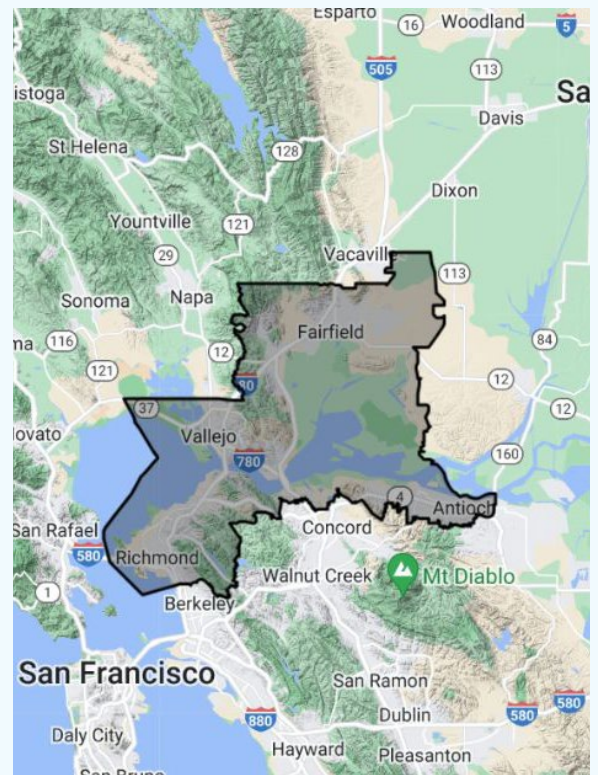

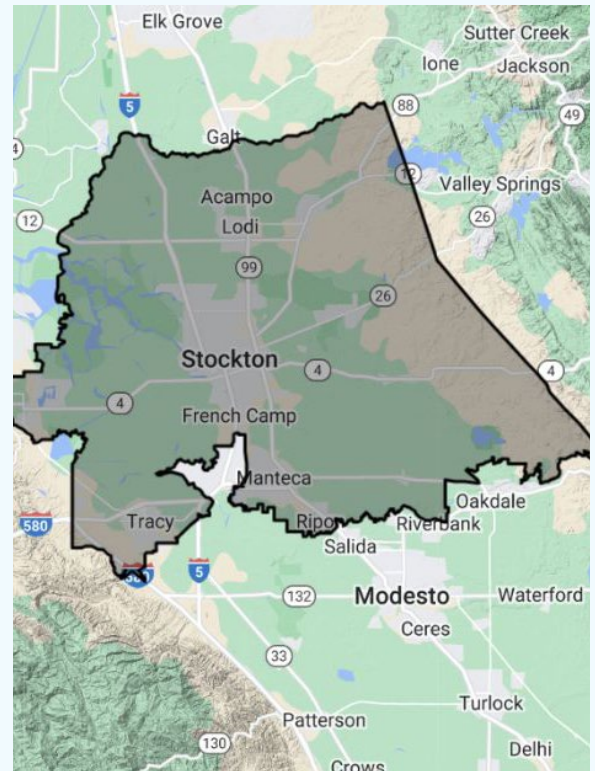

Before joining Congress, Representative DeSaulnier served in the State Senate (2008-2014). In 1994, Gov. Pete Wilson appointed him to fill a vacancy on the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors. The voters chose to keep him in the seat in that year's regular election. At the time, he was a registered Republican, but in 2000, he reregistered as a Democrat, triggering the wrath of local GOP activists. He served on the Board until 2006, when he was elected to the Assembly. DeSaulnier was born in Lowell, Mass., and received his bachelor's in history from the College of Holy Cross. Prior to becoming a county supervisor, he served as mayor of Concord and as a city councilmember from 1991-1993. He is a longtime restaurant owner and resident in Concord and the father of two adult sons. DeSaulnier previously ran for Congress in a November 2009 special election to fill the unexpired term of Ellen Tauscher, who resigned her seat to accept a position in the Obama Administration. DeSaulnier came in second for the Democratic runoff spot behind then Lt. Gov. John Garamendi.

COMMUNITY:

CD10 includes a portion of Alameda and Contra Costa Counties, the whole Cities of Clayton, Concord, Lafayette, Orinda, Pleasant Hill, San Ramon, Oakley, and Walnut Creek, the towns of Danville and Moraga, and portions of the Cities of Antioch, Brentwood, Dublin, and Martinez. The district includes many of the suburban areas of the East Bay along Interstate 680 and cities and communities along the Delta, where common interests include Delta management and recreation.

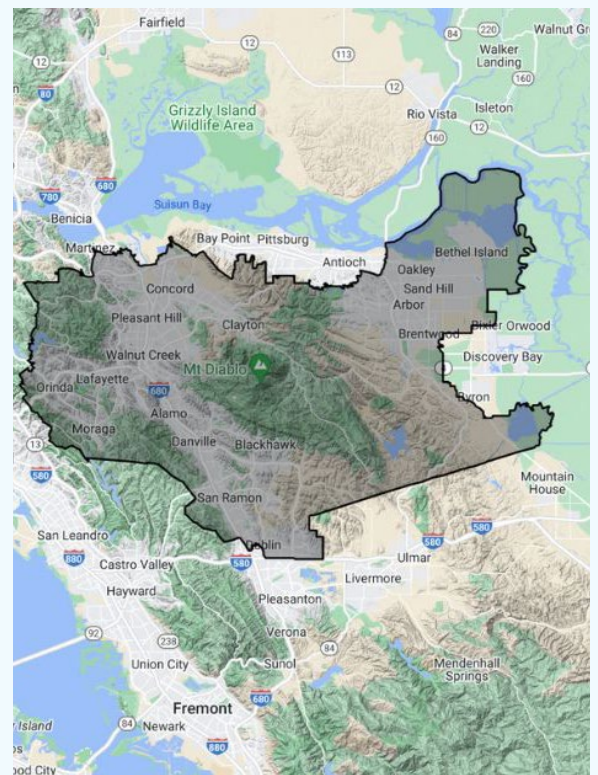

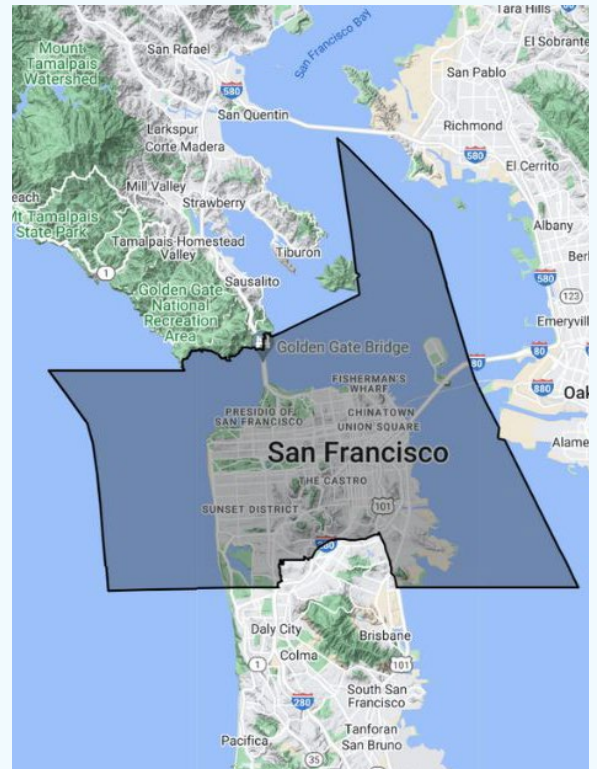

Speaker Emireta Pelosi grew up as a member of an influential Maryland political family. Her father, Thomas D'Alesandro Jr., served twelve years as mayor of Baltimore (1947-59) after serving five terms in Congress. Her brother, Thomas D'Alesandro III, is also a former Baltimore mayor (1967-71). She received her bachelor's in 1962 from Trinity College in Washington, D.C. Prior to her election to Congress, Pelosi was active in California and national Democratic politics, serving as chair of the CA Democratic Party (1981-83), finance chair of the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee (1985) and as Democratic National Committeewoman from California for 20 years (1976-1996). She and her husband, Paul Pelosi, the president of a venture capital company in San Francisco, have five children and nine grandchildren. On January 4, 2007, her House colleagues elected her Speaker of the House of Representatives, making her the highest-ranking woman in the history of the U.S. Congress. When Democrats regained control of the House of Representatives and she was once again elected Speaker in 2018 and 2020.

COMMUNITY:

CD11 includes a portion of the City and County of San Francisco. This district keeps most of San Francisco whole except for a southeastern portion to balance population, while connecting communities of interest in the southeastern portion of the city with their counterparts in San Mateo County. The district keeps historic as well as culturally and socioeconomically cohesive LGBTQ+ and immigrant communities intact. The district also includes a number of working-class communities such as Chinatown, Excelsior, Crocker Amazon, and Bayview-Hunters Point.

Representative Lee has worked in public service and politics her entire career. She worked on Shirley Chisholm’s presidential campaign in 1972 while in college and has said Ms. Chisholm inspired her to run for office. She also worked on the Black Panther co-founder Bobby Seale’s campaign for Oakland City Council. Her involvement in the campaign led the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) to surveil her work. After college, she went on to work for Representative Ron Dellums and became his chief of staff, one of the few African American women to hold such a senior position. She served in the California State Assembly (1990-1996) and the State Senate (1996-1998). She assumed office after a special election in 1998. She filled the position of her former boss, Representative Dellums. She is not seeking reelection and is running for the US Senate. She received degrees from Mills College (BA) and UC Berkeley (MA).

COMMUNITY:

CD12 includes a portion of Alameda County, including the whole Cities of Alameda, Albany, Berkeley, Emeryville, Oakland, and Piedmont, and a portion of the City of San Leandro. The City of San Leandro was split to balance population while considering communities of interest. This district is linked by Interstate 580 and Interstate 880, and features University of California, Berkeley, the Oakland Airport, and Oakland Children’s Hospital. Communities in this district have shared concerns related to gentrification, homelessness, and access to affordable housing.

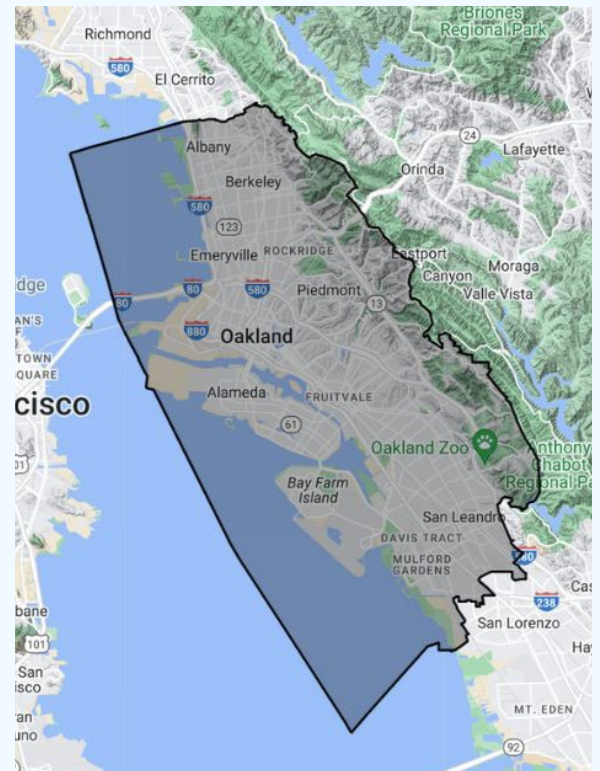

BIO:

Representative Duarte was elected to Congress in 2022, defeating Democrat Adam Gray by 564 votes in the 2nd-closest House race in the 2022 cycle. Duarte is a businessman and farmer whose Duarte Nursery grows almonds, pistachios, and grapes, and employs a thousand people throughout the Central Valley. The Duarte family has farmed the region for four generations and Duarte Nursery was founded in 1988 by John's parents, Jim and Anita Duarte. In 2013, the US Army Corps of Engineers cited his business for plowing a wheat field in Red Bluff several inches beyond the permissible depth and began a years-long prosecution seeking millions in fines over violations of the Clean Water Act. After a protracted period of litigation, Duarte Nursery agreed to settle with the Department of Justice, paying a \$330,000 civil penalty and purchasing \$770,000 worth of vernal pool mitigation credits. He resides in Modesto.

COMMUNITY:

CD13 includes all of Merced County, portions of Fresno, Madera, San Joaquin, and Stanislaus Counties, the whole Cities of San Joaquin, Patterson, Livingston, Dos Palos, Los Banos, Kerman, Madera, Atwater, Huron, Ceres, Mendota, Merced, Firebaugh, Lathrop, Coalinga, Newman, Gustine, and Chowchilla, and portions of the Cities of Modesto and Turlock. This district includes cities along Interstate 5 from Fresno County to San Joaquin County and communities along Highway 99. The district connects rural Valley communities with larger cities. These communities share interests in transportation and issues related to an agriculture- and food processing-based economy.

Despite this divide, Nevada has consistently voted for the presidential winner in nearly every election from 1912 to 2020, with exceptions in 1976 and 2016.
